### REFLECTIONS

As you might expect, I do a lot of reading. Much of what I read is religious, Christian, especially, but I like to read stories of faithful people, stories of people who have overcome great obstacles, stories of sportsmanship, stories of the sea, and other books and periodicals that intrigue me or promise enlightenment of some sort. Many of you know I read for Kansas Talking Books and my delightful assignment, lately, has been to read the bi-monthly “Angels on Earth” magazine.

Sometimes my “outside” reading, even though church-related, has competed with my Bible reading. And when this happens, I notice it almost immediately, because something seems to be missing in my everyday thought patterns. It’s like many of you have told me, “When I miss Church, things just aren’t right.”

I hope you spend time daily reading God’s Word. If you don’t, I urge you to start. The Bible really is a remarkable Book. But it is so much more than a Book—it really is God talking to us! I can remember a lot about many books I read, including periodicals, but none can compare with what I read in the Bible. The Bible may not be the latest news, but it helps me understand what is happening in the world. The Bible may not be science and technology, but it helps me see the hand of God in the noble works of human beings. The Bible doesn’t answer every question my mind can conceive nor does it explain everything that happens. My Bible does something much more important than answering age-old questions and explaining all the bizarre things we do...it puts me in touch with God. It teaches me to walk with God in paths of service, patience and humility. It tells me of the love and grace of God. The Bible is and does for me so much more than anything else I can read. Sometimes, as I read my Bible, I can hear the voice of God.

If you are not spending quality time in God’s Word everyday, I urge you to start—today, right now. And write a time everyday on your calendar to read God’s Word. Sometimes we consider ourselves too busy to read the Bible, or to pray. As God once said to me—while reading, “Bob, you are so busy you can’t afford NOT to pray and read your Bible!”

Really good advice.

## Highlights from the Kansas Disciple Women's Retreat (August 6-8 & 8-10) "Gather At The Well"

The Keynote Speaker and Bible Study leader for this year's retreat was Donna Rose-Heim, an ordained pastor in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). She currently shares a position with her husband Bill as Area Pastor of the Northwest Area of the Mid-America Region in Cameron, Missouri. Donna has written a book, "Dreamwalking". She believes when women focus on encouraging each other to dream with God and pursue those dreams they will see God's hand and heart more clearly at work in their midst.

This retreat couldn't have been more pertinent for those of us who attended! We were all encouraged to pursue our dreams and to witness God's hand at work in our lives. The four sessions with Donna included "Everyone Needs Water", "Tapping Into Living Water", "Freed To See With Living Water", "Living Water Flows Over". John 4:1-30, Jesus and the Woman of Samaria, was the Scripture used.

Through the excellent leading of Donna Rose-Heim, we pored over God's Word, sharing with one another times of rejoicing, what God was saying to each one of us in Scripture, and what "God and I" dream about. We made faith statements about ourselves and we made commitments to do specific, measurable things with God each day.

How does Jesus see us? Betty Hilton stated this retreat opened her eyes as she related to the woman at the well. Jesus offered her living water. Jesus offers us living water; are we going to accept it? The church has living water – is your tap on or off?

We were then challenged to allow the living water to flow from us. If we are living and breathing and moving, we are receiving the living water. **All we have to do is accept this living water!** Then wonderful things can happen! Yes, they truly can! And we dreamed them at retreat! Just ask anyone of us who attended the retreat! We only wish that others could have been there to be a part of what can happen when women get together and dream! Now we are committed to following through with our dreams!

The 2009 Kansas Disciple Retreat is already in planning stages. "Can You Hear Me Now?" is the theme for the 2009 retreat. More information will be forthcoming. Several women from First Christian Church are involved in the planning of this retreat. We earnestly ask for your prayers during the planning process.

## WEEK OF COMPASSION UPDATE

After leaving a path of devastation and death through the Caribbean, Hurricane Gustav bore down on the U.S. Gulf coast. Some two million people from south Alabama, across coastal Mississippi and Louisiana to southeast Texas have evacuated their homes in advance of Gustav's winds, rains and tidal surges. The Gulf Coast is still recovering from Hurricanes Katrina and Rita that devastated the region just 3 years ago.

At least 94 people were killed in the Dominican Republic, Haiti, Jamaica and Cuba and tens of thousands of homes were destroyed. Week of Compassion has already begun providing emergency grants to church partners in the Caribbean to support their relief and recovery efforts and is now garnering resources to respond to Gustav's wake in the Gulf South. Disciples have a strong network of Disciples Mission Stations across the region that will enable us to have an active and engaged participation in long term relief and recovery work.

Continuing relief and recovery efforts will be ongoing as soon as more information is available on Gustav's impact on our congregations and members and how we Disciples can best support relief and recovery efforts.

In the meantime, please remember all the people and communities in the Caribbean and the Gulf South who have been or will be affected with your prayers, plan to make a generous gift to WOC for hurricane relief and recovery.
